



## **Middletown train station location to be announced Monday**

An announcement on the site chosen for the new Middletown Amtrak station will be made at 11 a.m. Monday in the Middletown Borough Council chambers, 60 W. Emaus St., the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation announced today.

Rich Kirkpatrick, PennDOT spokesman, said he could not say which site has been selected. The announcement will be made by Toby Fauver, deputy secretary for local and area transportation.

PennDOT said the site was chosen after a feasibility study that included input from various stakeholders, public input and environmental and engineering analysis.

The existing station on Mill Street needs upgrades to make it compliant with the American With Disabilities Act. An engineering study concluded upgrading the existing station would be too costly because the station is on a curve and would have to be moved, requiring a new bridge over the Swatara Creek.

Sites still in contention, according to the engineering study, included land next to the A.P. Green warehouse at Ann Street and Route 230, and on Route 230 across from the Harrisburg International Airport.
