

## Amtrak station's McGovern Avenue entrance open

To remain open through Jan. 6, PennDOT says

The McGovern Avenue entrance to the Lancaster Amtrak station reopened Thursday afternoon and will remain open through Jan. 6, a PennDOT spokesman said.

"We've asked the contractor (J.D. Eckman) to leave the drive open to Jan. 6th," Pennsylvania Department of Transportation spokesman Greg Penny said in an email.

"After Jan. 6, they can either leave it open or close it again if they need it closed in order to conduct their work in that area," Penny said. "McGovern Avenue should open permanently when the bridge is open to traffic for the next phase, April to June (depending on how the weather affects the progress of the project)."

No word on when Keller Avenue will reopen, but Lancaster Newspapers asked. Check back later for an update.
